
Camden Council and our new design team are about to begin work to design approximately six Supported Living homes with 24-hour support staff presence on the estate. We will work with your community to take feedback on board and understand how this project could benefit Churchill Road Spencer Rise Estate.

Churchill Road Spencer Rise Estate Working with you

We have confirmed that this project will:



Deliver six supported living homes with 24-hour support staff presence



Require the removal of garages to build the homes. The team will work with users of the garages to understand ways of meeting their needs.



Allocate money to improving other parts of the estate as part of this project and we want to understand your priorities for this.

Since 2022, we have been speaking with local residents to understand how you feel about the Churchill Road Spencer Rise Estate, and get to know your concerns and priorities so they can be considered throughout the design process. Through our work we have found the following priorities:

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Landscape and playspaces



Play provision: equipment to create a focus area for play but include hard standing for scooting and cycling



Open space: improving the courtyard space outside



Addressing dog issues: dog waste bins, dog exercise area



Access and movement



Secure boundary: improving gates/security to prevent antisocial behaviour in the green space, vandalism and store shed break ins



Facilities



Improving recycling & bins area: improving existing facilities and minimising the impact of wind blowing waste around the estate



Storage: providing secure storage



Urban design



Heights: be sensitive to surrounding buildings and try to maintain street setting



Trees: keep existing trees along Spencer Rise if possible





Studio Partington's experience

Mayford Supported Living

Area: Camden

Client: London Borough of Camden

Tenure: Supported Living

Status: Completed

Studio Partington transformed the Mayford Day Centre in Camden into a high-quality residence for adults with diverse physical and learning disabilities.

The design prioritises a homely atmosphere, with a building that incorporates passive energy efficiency measures for sustainability and comfort.

Through consultations with residents' families, the team tailored the design to focus on providing unique communal spaces, including living, kitchen, and dining areas created to meet their needs.

Each resident enjoys a private garden, and there are two spacious communal gardens, promoting outdoor activities, fresh air, and contact with nature.







Windsor Street Supported Living

Area: Islington

Client: Islington Council Tenure: Supported Living Status: Under Construction

Windsor Street is a new residential building developed for the London Borough of Islington, providing supported accommodation for eleven adults with learning difficulties within their own community.

The team worked hard to reflect and respect the heritage of the site. Using materials that fit well into the surrounding area, they created a building that blends in with the street front and steps up along the slope of the site.

The design was developed with feedback from those who will use the building, to provide flexible accommodation for residents with a range of needs. Self contained units and shared accommodation is supported by additional communal and staff facilities.




